4 Compulsory Attendance

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6 To reach the goal of maximum educational benefits for every child requires a regular continuity of  
7 instruction, classroom participation, learning experiences, and study. Regular interaction of students with  
8 one another in classrooms and their participation in instructional activities under the tutelage of  
9 competent teachers are vital to the entire process of education. This established principle of education  
10 underlies and gives purpose to the requirement of compulsory schooling in every state in the nation. A  
11 student's regular attendance also reflects dependability and is a significant component of a student's  
12 permanent record.

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14 Parents or legal guardians or legal custodians are responsible for seeing that their children who are age  
15 seven (7) or older before the first (1<sup>st</sup>) day of school attend school until the later of the following dates:

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- 17 1. Child's sixteenth (16<sup>th</sup>) birthday; or
- 18 2. Completion date of the work of eighth (8<sup>th</sup>) grade.

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20 The provisions above do not apply in the following cases:

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- 22 (a) The child has been excused under one of the conditions specified in 20-5-102.
- 23 (b) The child is absent because of illness, bereavement, or other reason prescribed by the  
24 policies of the trustees.
- 25 (c) The child has been suspended or expelled under the provisions of 20-5-202.
- 26 (d) The child is excused pursuant to Section 2 of 20-5-103.

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28 Compulsory attendance stated above will not apply when children:

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- 30 1. Are provided with supervised correspondence or home study; or
- 31 2. Are excused because of a determination by a district judge that attendance is not in the best  
32 interests of the child; or
- 33 3. Are enrolled in a non-public or home school; or
- 34 4. Are enrolled in a school in another district or state; or
- 35 5. Are excused by the Board on a determination that attendance after age of sixteen (16) is not in the  
36 best interests of the child and the school.
